CALL TO ORDER/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Jamie Ramsey called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Jamie Ramsey requested Interim Town Manager/Town Clerk, Martina Burnam, to call the roll. Quorum was present.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

DISCUSSION AND VOTE TO FILL A COUNCIL SEAT AND UNEXPIRED TERM OF RECENTLY DECEASED COUNCIL MEMBER ROSE BRADFORD

The Town of Kearny advertised for letters of interest to fill the unexpired term of Rose Bradford pursuant to Kearny Town Code 2-1-4. The Town Council will vote on the applicants' letters of interest for the position.

Kearny Town Code: Section 2-1-4 Vacancies in Council¹

The council shall fill by appointment for the unexpired term any vacancy that may occur for whatever reason.

Arizona State Revised Statute: 9-235. Vacancies in council

A. The council shall fill a vacancy that may occur by appointment until the next regularly scheduled council election if the vacancy occurs more than thirty days before the nomination petition deadline, otherwise the appointment is for the unexpired term. This subsection does not apply to a charter city.

B. The member appointed shall meet the qualifications established in section 9-232.

The council seat will fill the term until next elections. The Town of Kearny will then hold a special election where the position will be set for re-election for a 2-year term.

The applicants who submitted their letters of interest are:

Tom O'Connor, Brian Coleman, Yadira Fierro, Jerry Moore, Mitchell Collings, Crystal Ann Shor, Jason Wernett and Arnold Mariscal.

It was recommended for council to vote their choice from above so that the new council member can be sworn in to take his or her place.

Each candidate presented him or herself to the Town Council, with the exceptions of Brian Coleman and Yadira Fierro who were absent. Brian Coleman was working for the Ambulance at the time.

Town Attorney Cooper informed Town Council due to there being a vacancy there are 6 votes on the council. To appoint a councilmember, you would need 4 affirmative votes for an individual from the council. Once you have reached 4 votes on that individual, that seat will be filled. So, your options are to either have nominations and vote on them here or you can narrow the field and consider a group of potential candidates by nomination first, and then discuss them, then upon receiving a second nomination to reduce the candidates. Then do motion and a second to appoint a candidate. 3 votes would not pass as it would be a deadlock, 4 votes would appoint that candidate and the voting would end because the seat would be filled. He reminded Mayor Ramsey that we will be doing this process again soon.

Councilmember Hinojos asked if we have to wait to vote for that second seat? Attorney Cooper stated yes, because we would have to advertise again, accept the resignation of the councilmember and then vote for the next one. He recommends directing staff to include these applicants' letters of interest in the next session for the new council seat so they do not have to reapply.

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Mayor Ramsey announced that Councilmember Samantha Misita has submitted her resignation from her council seat. So, we will be filling that seat also Councilmember Misita stated that she loved being on the council. She just didn't feel it was fair that she has currently not been able to attend in person due to the COVID19 pandemic. She will have to spend more time out of state due to her job changes, and she feels that someone who can be there in person on the council is important. Mayor Ramsey thanked her and congratulated her on her new endeavors.

Councilmember Misita suggested the council rank their choices to narrow the field.

Attorney Cooper stated Councilmember Herrera suggested the council make a motion of who they want to nominate and if a second motion is done, then conduct a vote. You can motion and second till you have 3 or 4 names, then vote on them. It is up to the council how you want to handle this.

Motion by Councilmember Herrera, **second** by Councilmember Hinojos, to nominate and appoint Thomas O'Connor as Town Councilmember. **Town Clerk Burnam conducted a roll call vote:** Mayor Ramsey voted **Yes**, Vice Mayor Radcliffe voted **Yes**, Councilmember Herrera voted **Yes**, Councilmember Flores voted **No**, Councilmember Misita voted **No** and Councilmember Hinojos voted **Yes**. There are 4 votes in favor and 2 votes that appose. Thomas O'Connor's nomination had a majority vote in favor of being appointed as Town Councilmember.

Judge Orzell was present to conduct the Oath of Office for Thomas O'Connor.

Attorney Cooper asked the Council how they wanted to direct staff to handle the applicants for the next appointment? Mayor Ramsey stated to include the current applicants. Attorney Cooper asked if council want to advertise for applicants again for the next council meeting? Mayor Ramsey stated yes.

NEW BUSINESS

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 21-03 AUTHORIZING THE SETTING OF FEES FOR TOWN SERVICES

Resolution 21-03, A Resolution of the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Kearny authorizing the setting of Fees for Town Services. Also, a list of services the Town of Kearny provides for residents and visitors. The list also includes the rates the Town currently charges and the increased amount the Town is requesting. The reason for the request to increase is to help supplement the increase of minimum wages and the increased costs to maintain the facilities.

It is recommended approving Resolution 21-03 A Resolution of the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Kearny authorizing the setting of Fees for Town Services.

This item was stabled to allow for 60 days' notice.

Motion by Councilmember Herrera, **second** by Vice Mayor Radcliffe to allow for 60 days' notice until our next regular meeting in May 2021. **Vote** –Mayor Jamie Ramsey, Vice Mayor Daniel Radcliffe,

Councilmembers David Herrera, Nancy Hinojos, Rudy Flores, Samantha Misita and Thomas O'Connor all voted in favor of the motion. **MOTION PASSED.**

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL OF RAY BEARCATS PARENT-TEACHER ORGANIZATION REQUEST

A letter from the Ray Bearcats Parent-Teacher Organization (PTO) requesting the council's permission to rent the Town pool and park for Saturday, May 29th, 2021 for a field day for the students. The students have not had any activities held by the school due to COVID19 cancellations. This would not be the school requesting this event. The PTO has provided proof of insurance as well. However, the Town Council may ask them to provide an event insurance and name the Town of Kearny as an additional insured.

Melissa Day President of the Ray PTO was present for any questions.

Attorney Cooper stated we are still under the Governor's Order for needing a COVID19 mitigation policy. Vice Mayor Radcliffe asked if the pool doesn't open, will they still have the event in the park? PTO President Day yes, they will still have the event. They would like to have an event similar to the ASARCO family day that was held a couple years ago.

Mayor Ramsey stated that as long as they have a COVID19 plan in place. Attorney Cooper stated if the council stated if the Council decides to open the pool.

Motion by Councilmember Herrera, **second** by Vice Mayor Radcliffe to Approve the request from Ray Bearcats Parent-Teacher Organization to rent the pool and park for Saturday, May 29th 2021 for a field day for students. If the pool is opened. **Vote** –Mayor Jamie Ramsey, Vice Mayor Daniel Radcliffe, Councilmembers David Herrera, Nancy Hinojos, Rudy Flores, Samantha Misita and Thomas O'Connor all voted in favor of the motion. **MOTION PASSED.**

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL FROM KEARNY LITTLE LEAGUE THE USE OF THE BALLPARK FIELDS FOR THEIR 2021 LITTLE LEAGUE SEASON FROM APRIL THROUGH JULY.

An email from Kearny Little League requesting the council's permission the use of the ballpark fields from April through July. Their board has met and voted to have a safe season following the state guidelines.

Also, Kearny Little League would like to paint and fix the bleachers and outside of the concession stand with donated time and paint from local volunteer Paul Sullivan.

Lisa Migliore was present for any questions.

Councilmember Hinojos asked of the Kearny Little League will provide and follow CDC guidelines? Migliore responded they will provide the needed information. Little League guidelines are more strict than the State's

Motion by Vice Mayor Radcliffe, **second** by Councilmember Herrera to Approve a request from the Kearny Little League to use the ballfields for their 20-21 season from April through July. **Vote** –Mayor Jamie Ramsey, Vice Mayor Daniel Radcliffe, Councilmembers David Herrera, Nancy Hinojos, Rudy Flores, Samantha Misita and Thomas O’Connor all voted in favor of the motion. **MOTION PASSED.**

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 21-04 DECLARING AS A PUBLIC RECORD CERTAIN DOCUMENTS FILED WITH THE TOWN CLERK AND ENTITLED “KEARNY TOWN CODE SECTIONS 3-5-4, 3-5-5 AND 3-5-6 RELATING TO THE DISPOSITION OF TOWN PROPERTY.”

Resolution 21-04, a Resolution of the Council of the Town of Kearny, Arizona, declaring as a public record certain documents filed with the Town Clerk and entitled “Kearny Town Code sections 3-5-4, 3-5-5 and 3-5-6 relating to the Disposition of town property”

The resolution will allow for changes to code to dispose of town property in a more expedient manner. For example, our current code states:

“Personal property belonging to the town and having a current value of less than \$1,000 or an original cost of less than \$1,000 may be declared surplus by the property administrator and may be sold after an invitation for bids for the purchase of the property has been published in a newspaper of general circulation in the town for two consecutive weeks preceding the sale.”

The new code would change to:

“Personal property belonging to the Town and having a current value of less than One Thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars or an original cost of less than One Thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars may be declared surplus by the Property Administrator and may be sold or traded without notice or advertisement for bids.”

There are more changes, and both the current Town Code and New Town Code request are included.

It is recommended approving Resolution 21-04 A Resolution of the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Kearny, Arizona, declaring as a public record certain documents filed with the Town Clerk and entitled “Kearny Town Code sections 3-5-4, 3-5-5 and 3-5-6 relating to the Disposition of town property”

Mayor Ramsey stated if we don’t advertise items that are worth under \$1,000.00 then we won’t give the community a fair opportunity to put in a bid to obtain that item.

Vice Mayor Radcliffe asked if this resolution would do away of having to put out to bid if it is under the \$1,000.00.

Attorney Cooper stated the Town’s personal property having a current value of less than \$1,000.00 or an original cost of less than \$1,000.00. The reason this is brought to you was because of the vehicles that were located in a lot in Apache Junction for over 8 years, and they were basically not salvage value not worth more than the costs of advertising. The Council has a right how to determine how they sell their property. You can direct us to not advertise in the newspaper but put on the website. If you have concerns of vehicles that way, it can be brought to your attention.

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Mayor Ramsey suggested reducing the amount to \$500.00. Town Clerk Burnam stated her concern is that the Town has Ambulance equipment that are going to have to go up for sale, for example, mattresses and cell phones. It is something we even can put up for public surplus.

Vice Mayor Radcliffe asked then you can list this in the paper and sell it as first come first serve. Attorney Cooper stated it can even be listed on our website or our social media. Town Clerk Burnam stated there is even an auction site we can list our items on.

Councilmember Herrera stated he has no objection to the \$1,000.00 amount, that he likes the idea of listing it on our website for the community to view and we are trusting our property administrator of setting the value and disposition of property. Councilmember O'Connor asked if the council would see the list first. Town Clerk Burnam stated yes, it would come to council first. Councilmember O'Connor stated then he is good with that.

The reason to declare it public record is to prevent having to publish it in the newspaper.

Motion by Councilmember O'Connor, **second** by Councilmember Herrera to Approve Resolution 21-045, a Resolution of the Council of the Town of Kearny, Arizona, declaring as a public record certain documents filed with the Town Clerk and entitled "Kearny Town Code sections 3-5-4, 3-5-5 and 3-5-6 relating to the Disposition of town property". **Vote** –Mayor Jamie Ramsey, Vice Mayor Daniel Radcliffe, Councilmembers David Herrera, Nancy Hinojos, Rudy Flores, Samantha Misita and Thomas O'Connor all voted in favor of the motion. **MOTION PASSED.**

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL OF ORDINANCE NO.21-219 OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF KEARNY, ARIZONA, AMENDING SECTIONS 3-5-4, 3-5-5 AND 3-5-6 OF THE KEARNY TOWN CODES, RELATING TO DISPOSITION OF TOWN PROPERTY AND SETTING AN EFFECTIVE DATE OF 30 DAYS AFTER ADOPTION

Ordinance 21-219, would amend Town Code sections 3-5-4, 3-5-5 and 3-5-6, which are related to the disposition of Town Property and setting an effective date of 30 days after adoption.

These codes were included with the Resolution 21-04 in this packet.

It is the recommended the approval of adopting Ordinance 21-219, an Ordinance of the Council of the Town of Kearny, Arizona, Amending sections 3-5-4, 3-5-5 and 3-5-6 of the Kearny Town Codes, relating to Disposition of Town Property and setting an effective date of 30 days after adoption.

Motion by Councilmember O'Connor, **second** by Councilmember Hinojos to Approve Ordinance 21-219, would amend Town Code sections 3-5-4, 3-5-5 and 3-5-6, which are related to the disposition of Town Property and setting an effective date of 30 days after adoption. **Vote** –Mayor Jamie Ramsey, Vice Mayor Daniel Radcliffe, Councilmembers David Herrera, Nancy Hinojos, Rudy Flores, Samantha Misita and Thomas O'Connor all voted in favor of the motion. **MOTION PASSED.**

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL OF OPENING THE TOWN POOL THIS SUMMER

Recently the Town of Kearny was informed of their water allotment from the Gila Water Commissioner was drastically reduced to 74.256-acre feet of water. As of 3/2/21 we pumped 31.7 total acre feet of water. On

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3/4/21 the Town posted on Facebook and around town that we are asking our community to help save water. With that being asked, should the Town open its pool for this year?

The amount of water to refill the pool after it is drained and cleaned is 207,000 gallons of water. The daily use of water at the pool (condensation and splash) is 2000 gallons a day for 2 months (or 60 days) would be needed to keep the pool filled for daily use. This is equal to 1-acre foot.

The pool does not generate a profit. Last year, the town had about \$3,703.00 in lost revenue.

Town staff would like the Town Council's direction to open the pool or remain closed until we receive any updated allotment numbers from the Gila Water Commissioner.

Councilmember Herrera is in favor of opening the pool. It is what the children look forward to every year. It helps keep them entertained and their health up. Whatever the cost is we will find a way to keep it open.

Councilmember Misita asked why we have to drain it every year? If we used chemicals throughout the year, we shouldn't have to drain it every year. Payables Clerk Kenney stated that Public Works Supervisor Kenney has informed the town, because of our water, the use of high-quality chemicals is not possible. The chemicals leave a layer of grime on the bottom of the pool. stated historically the Town has worked hard to keep it open. It is a cornerstone for kids. This has been a big deal. We need a better plan in place. Test the water before draining.

Mayor Ramsey suggested we shock our pools to get it back to where it needs to be.

Jay Wernett stated he's worked with pools for over sixteen years. Not maintaining in the winter time there are some long-term costs ramifications. The surface of the pool, the town spent lots of money resurfacing the pool. Not taking care of the pool year-round could be costly. It's in the town's best interest to maintain the pool throughout the year.

Vice Mayor Radcliffe asked if the pool would need to be completely drained? Resident Jay Wernett said he would need to look at the pool.

Town Manager Jakubowski Wolz stated the Public Works Director had said there is sediment and debris on the bottom of the pool, although they maintain with half chemical throughout the summer, it still needs to be drained. There are tiles that need to be fixed and the opportune time would be when the pool is drained. That is also a hazard to the kids.

Resident Jay Wernett stated you can fix those tiles without having to drain the pool. You can also bypass chlorine by bypassing the filter system and run the pumps to use the suction from the pumps.

Councilmember Hinojos stated they've been told in that past not to drain the pool that it is better to keep it.

Resident Jay Wernett if you drain the pool, you can damage it more, with unseen air pockets on the bottom.

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Town Manager Jakubowski Wolz stated that she was told it wouldn't sit empty for too long.

Councilmember O'Connor would like to know the about the costs of the pool. If the pool in prior years had the same loss? Town Clerk Burnam stated she was told historically it hasn't been revenue generating. Last year was actually less than previous years. Payables Clerk Kenney stated we've had more donations, and we opened more nights and had more functions for the kids to do.

Vice Mayor Radcliffe stated for as many years he's been on the council; this is one of the things we need for the kids in the summer time and for the community.

Councilmember Hinojos asked Pinal County Supervisor Cavanaugh if he could assist with grants or other assistance to help open the pool. Supervisor Cavanaugh stated he would see what he could do to help the Town of Kearny. That they have a great grant writer that can assist us with that. They've also received funds from COVID relief funding there are some specific criteria for spending for that, we can look into it.

Mayor Ramsey we need to reutilize any water from the pool we remove, if possible.

Resident Mr. Bartlett asked if there is going to be a COVID plan in place? Town Clerk Burnam stated they will still use the same plan as they did last year.

Resident Wernett would recommend checking on the levels on the water in the pool first, before making any large decisions.

Councilmember Misita stated historically the town has worked so hard to keep the pool open no matter what. They recent raised money to keep it open. It is a cornerstone in the community, and it is the only thing we have for our kids in the community. We need to have a better plan throughout the year to open to pool every summer for the kids.

Vice Mayor Radcliffe asked Mr. Wernett would talk to Ray Camacho, Public Works director. Mr. Wernett stated he would.

Motion by Councilmember Misita, **second** by Councilmember Hinojos to Approve opening the pool this summer. **Vote** –Mayor Jamie Ramsey, Vice Mayor Daniel Radcliffe, Councilmembers David Herrera, Nancy Hinojos, Rudy Flores, Samantha Misita and Thomas O'Connor all voted in favor of the motion. **MOTION PASSED.**

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 21-05, A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF TH ETOWN OF KEARNY, PINAL COUNTY, ARIZONA, AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION FOR A GRANT REQUEST TO THE GILA RIVER INDIAN COMMUNITY FOR FUNDING OF MILO SYSTEM UPGRADES IN THE AMOUNT OF \$6,985.00

A Resolution 21-05, a Resolution of the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Kearny, Pinal County, Arizona, Authorizing the submission of an application for a grant request to the Gila River Indian Community for funding of MILO System upgrades in the amount of \$6,985.00.

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The Town of Kearny has a need for the upgrades of Police MILO System to include additional training modules that are mandated by AZPOST in an approximate amount of \$6,985.00 dollars

It is recommended approving Resolution 21-05, A Resolution of the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Kearny, Arizona, Authorizing the submission of an application for a grant request to the Gila River Indian Community for funding of MILO System upgrades in the amount of \$6,985.00.

Chief Kenney was present for any questions.

Chief Kenney stated it is for firearms only video-based training. The grant would help with upgrades to do more realistic training, for example, decision making and de-escalation. Training is mandated by AZPOST. This will allow for the mandated training to be completed in Kearny and travel to the larger cities for training will not be needed. There is a high-demand for this training and will also generate revenue for the department and town

Councilmember Herrera asked we can do some housekeeping before submitting.

Councilmember O'Connor stated that \$7,000 doesn't like a lot of money? Does it offer racial discrimination training?

Chief Kenney stated this is basically a firearms training and speaking to the person in question.

Motion by Councilmember O'Connor, **second** by Vice Mayor Radcliffe to Approve Resolution 21-05, a Resolution of the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Kearny, Pinal County, Arizona, Authorizing the submission of an application for a grant request to the Gila River Indian Community for funding of MILO System upgrades in the amount of \$6,985.00. **Vote** –Mayor Jamie Ramsey, Vice Mayor Daniel Radcliffe, Councilmembers David Herrera, Nancy Hinojos, Rudy Flores, Samantha Misita and Thomas O'Connor all voted in favor of the motion. **MOTION PASSED.**

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

1. Water Allotment Update

Recently the Town of Kearny was informed of their water allotment from the Gila Water Commissioner was drastically reduced to 74.256-acre feet of water. As of 3/2/21 we pumped 31.7 total acre feet of water. On 3/4/21 the Town posted on Facebook and around town that we are asking our community to help save water

2. COVID19 CASES ON THE RISE

- We've had an officer test positive, and another officer and dispatcher exposed to COVID19. They are all back to work, after testing negative.
- According to AZDHS 406 people from Kearny Zip code have been vaccinated.
- As of 3/12/2021 we've had 159 positive cases in the Kearny Zip code area.

- Latest numbers specifically for current positive cases have not been updated by Pinal County. They are no longer tracking these numbers.

3. PAYMENT PLAN AND THE CURRENT SHUT-OFF LISTS

- The payment plan and letters have been working and our shutoff lists have gotten smaller.
- Payment plan allowed them to pay off by end of June 2021.

4. RECLAIMED WATER FOR BALLPARK FIELDS

- The Town of Kearny met with NCS Engineers to talk about the reclaimed water pipes project needed to move them from going to the golf course to the ballfields.
- The WWTP currently is set up to use reclaimed for the golf course, but have not done that for a few years.
- The pipeline from the WWTP to the golf course is (4") and runs by the ball park only a few thousand yards from the WWTP. The town of Kearny needs (560 ft.) of pipe to feed the (2") sprinkles. We may need a pressure reducer also. The Town of Kearny needs an estimate of the cost so they can let the council know, so they can get funding.
- The current USDA funding is for water, not waste water and we would need totally separate funding for the future WWTP project, which would take time. The council would want this project ASAP so may need to fund this internally, if you decide to go that way.
- A request was made for a site engineer to come and give us an idea how much it would cost to redirect the reclaimed water.

Vice Mayor Radcliffe suggested asking the mines to assist with pipe.

Councilmember Hinojos asked if the golf course not utilizing that water anymore?

Judge Orzell explained they have their own water well, and haven't had reclaimed the water for over a year.

Vice Mayor Radcliffe explained that we don't have the amount of reclaimed water needed for the golf course.

Mayor Ramsey asked Town Clerk Burnam about permits needed to do the work. Town Clerk Burnam explained yes, we are going to have to apply for permits to do the work. That is why we won't have this ready by May.

Motion by Vice Mayor Radcliffe, **second** by Councilmember O'Connor to approve the reports from the Kearny Police Department. **Vote** –Mayor Jamie Ramsey, Vice Mayor Daniel Radcliffe, Councilmembers David Herrera, Samantha Misita, Rudy Flores, Nancy Hinojos and Thomas O'Connor all voted in favor of the motion. **MOTION PASSED**

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
ADJOURNMENT


